

DCU St Patrick's Campus, Drumcondra lies on the main Dublin-Belfast route, and Airport-City Centre route, and many commuter buses and taxis pass directly by the campus.

In the interest of sustainability, and as parking is limited on campus with *clamping in operation*, we strongly encourage the use of public transport (See suggestions overleaf).

Park-by-Text (app or browser) Pay and display parking is available on the left hand side as you enter the campus through the main gates. We have a limited number of parking permits available. Please ask at registration: Cost €3.00 per day. Some free parking is available on the side streets adjacent to the campus.

Taxis may be flagged from the main road outside the campus, or hailed using various apps, e.g., "Free Now".



From city centre, ask for St Patrick's Campus Drumcondra, library entrance (beside the Skylon Hotel).




